Acting is.... Child's Play

Child's Play Touring Theatre is a 501(c)3 educational arts organization whose mission is to share, encourage and validate the creativity of children by performing original works of theatre, music and dance adapted from literature written by young authors. (Interesting fact: Tina Fey used to work for them!)

Description: Improvisational games have been used as excellent developmental tools for children for ages now. From the early days of Viola Spolin teaching children how to mirror each other at the Hull House, to the children of today "getting their wiggles out" on Yo Gabba Gabba, improv games make for the most inclusive and expressive forms of recreation for kids. A one hour session, once a week, for six weeks, will teach children to play games that they will want to play for years to come because they're fun. The added bonus: these games can teach children valuable lessons. In games like "Zip Zap Zop", children learn the most important characteristics of strong communication and listening skills like eye contact, and articulation. In games like "Cereal," children learn to recognize patterns and build patterns together. In games like "Freeze," children learn discipline by physically recognizing their surroundings. And, if nothing else, improv games will allow the kids to bawlk like chickens and project wild emotions so much that they'll be slumped over their seat belts passed out in the back seat before you can get them home. You're welcome.

Chess Scholars was founded in 2001 and is dedicated to providing professional chess instruction and promoting scholastic chess in Northern Illinois, Southern Wisconsin and Northwestern Indiana. Chess Scholars has been featured in the *Chicago Tribune* and the *Daily Herald*. Currently, Chess Scholars serves over 250 school and community centers.

Description: No previous knowledge of chess is necessary! Each class will consist of a fun interactive teaching period and guided practice time. Both new and returning participants are welcome and will get to the next level under the guidance of an experienced Chess Scholars coach. Children will have an opportunity to test for a Chess Belt® under a unique Chess Scholars system patterned after martial arts belts. There will also be a competition with prizes and a celebration at the end of the session. **Each first-time participant will receive a free chess set to take home.**
